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Section 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin. Wash immediately with plenty of soap and water. Drench the affected skin with running water for 10 minutes or longer if substance is still on skin. Obtain medical attention if ill effect or irritation develops

Eye contact: Bathe the eye with running water for 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Obtain medical attention if pain, blinking, tears or redness persist.

Ingestion: Wash out mouth with water. Provide fresh air. Do not induce vomiting. If unconscious, check for breathing and apply artificial respiration if necessary. Call a poison center or doctor/physician if you feel unwell. Consult a doctor.

4.3. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Turn leaking containers leak-side up to prevent the escape of liquid.
